Beer lovers who want to know more about their ale than how it tastes have plenty of options in Philly. Tour this batch of local craft breweries and be sure to sample the wares.

Philadelphia Brewing Company

A relative newcomer, the company brews four year-round styles named for Philly-centric themes. Kenzinger golden ale is the most popular and takes its name from the factory's Kensington neighborhood, once home to more than 50 operating breweries. Free tours of the renovated 124-year-old building are available from noon to 3 p.m. every Saturday. Beer is sold every day except Sunday.

Yards Brewing Company

When it opened 15 years ago, Yards became the first licensed brewery within the city limits since Schmidt's folded in 1987 — a closure that left the city without a commercial brewery for the first time in 300 years. Yards has now moved into bigger and more modern digs along the Delaware River, where Revolutionary Ales are made from the recipes of the Founding Fathers. You can buy them on site by the case and take a free Saturday tour.

Earth Bread + Brewery

Serving the residential Mount Airy neighborhood since October, this brewpub produces four house draughts, including a critically acclaimed smoked wheat ale called Terra Fume. The other brews change frequently. For noshing, try the hearth-baked flatbreads.

Triumph Brewing Company

Old City's first brewpub is an artfully designed urban outpost of New Jersey-based Triumph Brewing Company. Beer sophisticates enjoy gastropub fare and eight seasonal draughts, including Honey Wheat, a gold medalist at the Great American Beer Festival. The brewmaster leads free tours at 1 and 3 p.m. every Saturday.
